Please note: The above documentation is suitable for fruit and juice coming from all areas, including phylloxera-infested zones, as long as the conditions declared above have been met. Permits or certification are required by the state of origin to enable fruit to be moved out of these zones. Conditions

1. Samples are to be securely packaged in a well-sealed bag or container to avoid cross-contamination.
2. Records of sample treatment and site details are kept by the sender and cross-referenced with the AWRI Laboratory Identification numbers upon receipt of reports.
3. **FOR PEZ:** A Plant Health Certificate (PHC) specifying the **origin of the material** is to be obtained from the state of origin. The certificate is to accompany the consignment and a copy retained by the sender.
4. **FOR PIZ/PRZ:** A Plant Health Certificate (PHC) specifying the **origin of the material and the treatment process** is to be obtained from the state of origin. The certificate is to accompany the consignment and a copy retained by the sender.
5. **Samples from a PIZ or PRZ** must be frozen at -18°C or less for a minimum of 24 hours prior to transport to the AWRI and indicated on the PHC. Juice samples may be placed in a sealed, unbreakable vessel.

A copy of the attached form MUST accompany the samples along with any other paperwork, ie PHC, purchase order etc. A PHC can be obtained by contacting the relevant branch or office of your local Dept of Primary Industries in your state.

Samples not meeting the above conditions may be isolated and possibly disposed of without notice.
