Title of Position: Casual Technical Officer (0.6 FTE)

Reporting to: Research Scientist

Overview: The Laboratory Technician uses technical and analytical skills as part of a team

to provide assistance in the flavour research area, with a focus on the analysis of

flavour compounds and the routine maintenance of GC/MS instruments.

Qualifications: A relevant degree in chemistry such as BSc, BSc (Hons), having majored in C

Chemistry, analytical Chemsitry or related field

Experience: Some exposure to practical quantitative analytical chemistry is desirable.

Principal Accountabilities:

- 1. Provides technical assistance for the applied research on the chemistry of wine flavour.
- 2. Prepares extracts for analysis by GC/MS.
- 3. Assists in the operation of GC/MS instruments and data processing.
- 4. Under direction, undertakes routine maintenance of the benchtop GC-MS instruments.
- 5. Maintains clean stocks of glassware and stocks of redistilled solvents and other laboratory chemicals, as well as other laboratory consumables.
- 6. Assists in the drafting and reviewing of relevant Risk Assessments.
- 7. Accepts that all Intellectual Property, Patents and discovery arising during the course of employment at the AWRI remains the property of the AWRI.
- 8. Undertakes any other duties as directed by the Managing Director.
- 9. Promotes the well being of the AWRI by ensuring that all contact with clients, staff or the public is performed in a professional manner.

Person Specification:

- 1. Well developed communication skills, both verbal and written, to facilitate understanding of technical matters by a range of people both internal and external to AWRI.
- 2. Practical/mechanical abilities, instrumental problem solving skills
- 3. Efficient time management skills.
- 4. Excellent interpersonal skills to be able to work effectively in a team environment.
- 5. Displays initiative and the capacity to self-motivate.
