Title of Position: Laboratory Technician

Reporting to: Senior Laboratory Technician

Overview:

The Laboratory Technician uses technical and analytical skills as part of a team to provide an accurate and reliable analytical service to predominantly wine industry clients. These services include export certification for wine and other quality control analyses of wine and grape products.

Qualifications: A relevant degree in Science such as BSc, BSc (Hon) or related discipline

like an Oenology degree

Experience: Wine related study and/or laboratory experience preferred

Principal Accountabilities:

- 1. Performs chemical and microbiological analyses on wine and grape as required. The range of analyses performed will be within the scope of current experience and training. These analyses are to be performed in a timely and efficient manner in accordance with the quality criteria established during method validation and documentation.
- Contributes to the maintenance of the NATA accreditation and quality of the Analytical Service Laboratory by performing analyses according to agreed quality parameters, performing calibration of equipment according to schedule and complying with instructions detailed in the quality manual or other related documents.
- 3. Enters and checks test results and other data as required into the LIMS.
- 4. Takes responsibility for laboratory housekeeping, cleanliness, and the disposal of surplus samples.
- 5. Undertakes any other duties as directed by the Group Manager Commercial Services.
- 6. Promotes the well being of the AWRI by ensuring that all contact with clients, staff or the public is performed in a professional manner.

Person Specification:

- 1. Well developed communication skills, both verbal and written, to facilitate understanding of technical matters by a range of people both internal and external to AWRI.
- 2. Efficient time management skills.
- 3. Excellent interpersonal skills to be able to work effectively in a team environment.
- 4. Displays initiative and the capacity to self-motivate.
