

Introduction to Sustainable Winegrowing Australia and carbon calculating workshop

Both in Australia and internationally, there is a growing focus on sustainable grape and wine production. This is increasing interest in sustainability credentials for vineyards and wineries, as well as new production techniques.

This workshop will present a range of drivers for sustainable production and demonstrate the tools and resources available through Sustainable Winegrowing Australia to support the adoption of sustainable practices.

It will explore how to use the Australian Wine Carbon Calculator and discuss the input categories and emissions factors. The workshop will detail life-cycle assessments to better define emissions within the wine industry and some of the mitigation strategies for viticulture and winemaking businesses.

Case studies will show how Sustainable Winegrowing Australia members benchmark their greenhouse gas emissions against other members.
