Step by step guide to obtaining a Pinot G Style Spectrum classification – the 'restricted use' option for users who wish to find out a wine's classification for internal company use only.

If you choose to submit a sample for classification without completing a licensing agreement with the AWRI, you are only permitted to use the result for internal purposes within your company. You are not permitted to communicate the result to third parties, and you will not receive a graphic for use on your label.

However, if at a later date you decide that you would like to be able to use this result in external communications, or would like to be able to use the label graphic, you can submit the required paperwork to convert to this option.

The main purpose of offering the 'restricted use' option is to provide a quick service to those interested in finding out where their wines sit on the Spectrum, particularly for wines that are already packaged. Potential users of the Spectrum are generally encouraged to complete the licensing agreement and receive the Spectrum graphic file, as this offers more flexibility for the same classification fee.

1. Finalise your blend before sending in a sample.

Please do not submit your wine for classification until the blend has been completely finalised and is ready for bottling. (This service is also suitable for already-packaged wines.) Additionally, please ensure that your wine has a **sugar level of less than 10 g/L**.

2. Submit 2 x 750 mL samples accompanied by the Sample Submission form

Please complete one *Sample Submission form- restricted use option* per wine and send it with 2 x750 mL samples to: **Commercial Services, The Australian Wine Research Institute, Wine Innovation Central Building, Corner of Hartley Grove and Paratoo Road, Urrbrae SA, 5064.** You will be invoiced a \$290 classification fee per wine submitted.

3. When you receive your result, ensure it is only used for internal purposes, and not communicated to third parties under any circumstances.
